The Tasaday Controversy: Assessing the Evidence

In 1971 a band of cave-dwelling people called Tasaday were discovered living in a remote area of rain forest in the Philippines. These 26 people were reported to be following a paleolithic lifestyle, surviving solely on wild foods, and wearing leaves for clothing. After the international flurry of news articles and TV films in the early 1970s, no further word was heard about the

Tasaday for thirteen years. Then, in 1986, news reports suddenly flooded the international press claiming that the whole story had been a hoax.

Are the world-famous Tasaday the most primitive people on Earth, one of the major anthropological discoveries of the century? Or were they the hoax of the decade? In this volume, 19 scholars, 9 of whom did fieldwork in the Tasaday area, present their differing views on this controversy.
