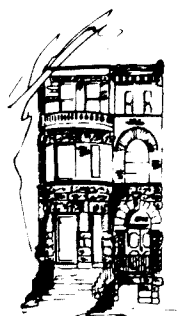

GENERAL INFORMATION

ABSTRACTS

Copies of *Abstracts* of papers presented at this meeting may be obtained for \$2.00 to members, \$3.00 to non-members, either at the time of registration or from the Association's membership and publications desk in the Gold Room Foyer of the Fairmont Hotel.

ADVANCE REGISTRATION

Meeting materials have been mailed to all advance registrants in the continental US; other advance registrants should claim badges and programs at the advance registration desk in the Loggia (Fairmont Hotel) from 5 pm to 9 pm on Tuesday, and from 8 am to 4 pm Wednesday through Saturday. The Loggia is located between the Cirque and the Pavilion rooms on the hotel's Mason Street floor level. Participants in the scientific program may leave their papers for the paper distribution center with registration personnel.

ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING

The Council of the Association meets Thursday at 9 pm in the Grand Ballroom (Fairmont Hotel). President Ernestine Friedl will chair the meeting; incoming President Walter Goldschmidt will address the Council. All Fellows and Voting Members in good standing are members of the Council and are urged to attend.

CONFERENCE OF DEPARTMENT REPRESENTATIVES

Department representatives are invited to a meeting chaired by incoming President Walter Goldschmidt to discuss topics of concern to departments and the Association on Wednesday at 7 pm in the French Room (Fairmont Hotel).

COPIES OF PAPERS

Copies of many of the papers to be presented at this meeting are available for a small service fee (25¢) through the paper distribution center located in the California Room on the mezzanine level of the Fairmont Hotel. The center will be open from 8 am to 6 pm Wednesday through Saturday. Although papers may be delivered to the center from 8 am to 6 pm during the week, staff will be available to receive papers beginning Tuesday morning. Papers may also be left with the registration personnel. Participants are asked to deliver 20 copies of their papers to the center or to registration personnel as early in the meeting as possible. The facility will be operated on a self-service basis; papers will be arranged by program session and paper number.

INFORMATION AND MESSAGE CENTER

Signs in the registration area will indicate the location and schedule for interviews, but informal discussion is also welcome at any time. Information on eligibility of projects and application procedures may also be obtained by writing directly to the National Science Foundation, Washington, DC 20550.

PLACEMENT SERVICE

For those who wish to register positions open or wanted, the Placement Service, located in the Hunt Room on the mezzanine level of the Fairmont Hotel, *will open for registration only* on Tuesday from 5 pm to 7 pm, and on Wednesday from 9 am to 1 pm. The service's facilities will open officially at 2 pm on Wednesday; daily hours through Saturday are 9 am to 7 pm. PRESS

In order to safeguard authors' copyrights, the following statement should appear on the first page of each copy: "Quotation of isolated portions (not exceeding four lines) for purposes of reviews or news articles is permitted. All other rights are reserved by the author and other quotations may not be made without written consent of the author."

PROGRAM CHANGES

Copies of the newsletter are distributed with registration materials and are available at both the advance and on-site registration desks.

RECORDING SESSIONS

Persons who wish to record scholarly sessions should follow normal scholarly convention and obtain the permission of the person to be recorded and of the organizer of the session to be recorded. In addition, there should be no publication of such recorded material without following scholarly procedure regarding permission and citation.

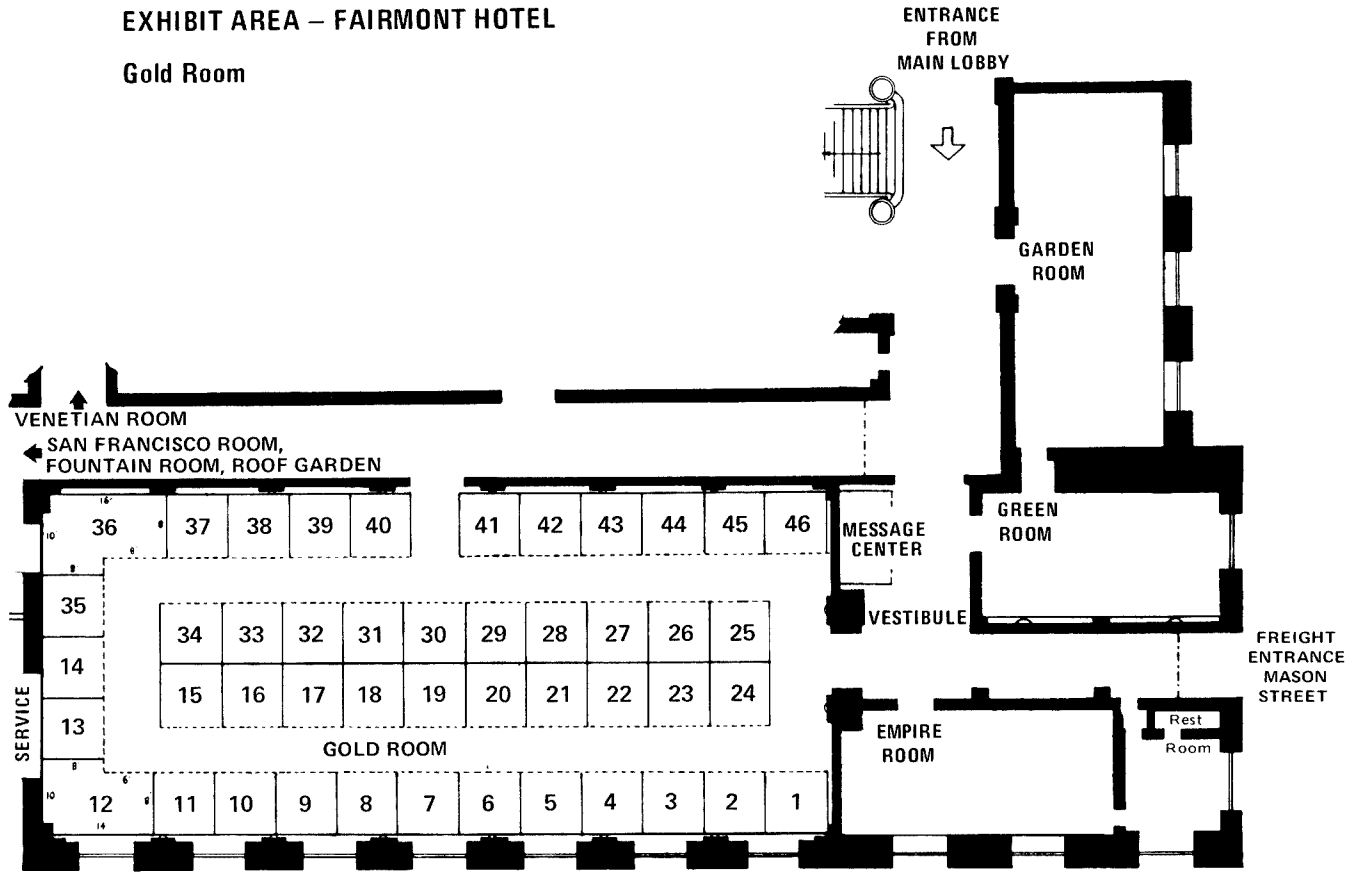
